Virtually all of the sources of law in Article 38(1) of the Statute of the International Court of Justice have served, in varying degrees, as sources of law in the WTO. The authors examine the development and significance of each of these sources of law in WTO jurisprudence.	398
"Indigenous Peoples" in International Law: A Constructivist Approach to the Asian Controversy "Indigenous peoples" as an international legal concept has been justified by particular histories in states formed by European colonial settlement, but is increasingly applied globally, prompting sharp protests and calls for a narrow definition by several Asian states. This article proposes broader justifications and a flexible, but focused, definition. It makes a constructivist argument that such global concepts are not sharply defined but are dynamic abstractions, continuously drawing from and shaping the diverse categories and circumstances of different societies and institutions.	414
